National Committee Sometime in March-Apr

1. Mungarian Brigadier General, Andrea ZAKO, born at Brasso on 23 March 1898, residing in Austria, as result of instructions from the Hungarian National Committee, see reference, maintainscontacts with Hungarian emigre leaders in European countries. In addition, the Hungarian National Committee entrusted him with the task, among others, of very secret preparation of the paramilitary organizations of Hungarian youths abroad in order to avoid that they be caught unprepared in case of international complications.

- 2. This organization has about 80,000 Hungarian members who are found in Western Germany and who constitute a sensible reserve of men decisive in fighting against Communism.
- 3. Subject early in December 1950 passed through Rome, returning from a trip to France and Spain. Subject's representative in Italy is the well known Ference SKERGULA SIMONFAY. During his brief stay in Italy Subject made contact with Hungarian leaders in Rome, among whom, the former Minister, APOR. Subject is personally known to Source.
