1. Since [ ] opinion on the Andras ZAKO problem is stated in para 1 of MAS-W-202, [ ] checked with [ ] for further details.

2. [ ] purports to know nothing about the ZAKO complex and claimed not even to recognize the name when it was first raised by Finnett. After Finnett identified General ZAKO, [ ] said that he had very limited knowledge of the rightist groups and his chief source of what little information he had was his boyhood friend Toni (Antal) RADVANSZKY, now living in Paris.

3. According to [ ], RADVANSZKY is not a Nazi, and in fact saved the lives of several Jews during the Hungarian Nazi period. In 1943 Admiral HORTHY sent RADVANSZKY abroad as one of four Hungarian representatives whose primary task was to see to the safeguarding of Hungarian assets (Tibor ECKHARDT of the Hungarian National Council was also one of the four). RADVANSZKY belongs to the old Hungarian Protestant aristocracy. In Paris he maintains relations with Otto HABSBURG. His relation to Hungarian rightist and Arrow Cross circles is prompted, according to [ ] by the feeling that these groups represent the only armed striking force among Hungarian refugees. RADVANSZKY allegedly is not in accord with the political aims of these groups, but feels that any Hungarian government in exile must draw upon them for effective resistance to the Communist regime. Lately, RADVANSZKY attempted to obtain an American visa in order to attend a convention of the World Protestant Federation. Apparently he was not successful in obtaining the visa. [ ] mentioned that he had discussed the RADVANSZKY case with either [ ] or [ ] in Paris not too long ago.

4. As for Colonel Mihaly NAGY, [ ] has a high opinion of his probity and is, of course, acquainted with him. The statement in MAS-W-202 that [ ] advocates replacement of ZAKO by NAGY is, however, an overstatement of the case since, as mentioned above, [ ] is barely on the fringes of the MHBK internal intrigues.
