Detective William O'Rourke, Special Operations Squad, Nassau County, New York, Police Department, advised on May 7, 1974, that the "Society of the Survivors of the Riga Ghetto" is sponsoring a demonstration in front of subject's residence, 232 Grant Avenue, Minebla, New York, beginning at 3:00 PM May 14, 1974.

The demonstration will be joined by membership of the Nassau County Chapter of the Anti-Defamation League, B'Nai Brith.

Its. stated objective is the immediate deportation of subject to the Soviet Union according to Mr. Lawrence Oppenheimer, 701 177th Street, New York City, who has advised the Nassau County Police Department he is one of the organizers of the demonstration.

Concerning Boleslavs Maikovskis, it is noted that according to an article which appeared in the "New York Times" edition of September 12, 1965, he was tried in absentia in the Soviet Union and found guilty of crimes including murder and sentenced to death. He is charged with having been a member of the Nazi SS in the Riga-Latvia area during the German occupation and reportedly ordered the burning of a Latvian village and the execution of many of its citizens.

The Soviet Union demanded his extradition during 1965, but to date the extradition order has not been executed by the United States.

Maikovskis, reportedly born in 1904, is a retired carpenter presently residing at 232 Grant Avenue, Mineola, New York.
