SUBJECT: *Wojciech Malaka's sister*

1. It has come to our attention that Eiccolai Malaka, now resident in the U.S., has a sister who is still detained in Rumania. Through an intermediary in the U.S. who is working through a Dr. A. Schaefer, General Director der Schweizerischen Bankgesellschaft, efforts are being made to get the sister out of Rumania.

2. The following text of a letter from Dr. Schaefer to the U.S. Intermediary, dated 22 May 50, is transmitted as of possible interest to OSG:

When you very much for your letter of 14 November. Our reply, dated 17 November, has probably reached you by now. As you I would naturally like to write to you about the case of our mutual acquaintance Mr. Malaka. So have I personally done our best to assist in various competent matters regarding the release of his sister, especially in connection with our success. Mr. Malaka, the Rumanian, is here in the town of Switzerland, explained to us the steps necessary to take from the first step to the release of the case. This subject as political and we consider it therefore extremely important. We are to intervene for her. It is very difficult to get an arrangement in connection with the family. Rumanian representatives whom we approached at the beginning of November, as a result of which they would be glad to help in the case, but the Swiss Intermediary, however, believes that there is no immediate chance of a favorable solution of this case.

I would be glad to assist you in any way possible. Malaka about our efforts which are at least for the time being without any result, and we think certain that we should be able to help.

3. Unless your circumstances are such to desire, OSG would like to contact you in this matter.
