"After his arrival in the United States VALAHU sought a position with the Voice of America and the National Committee for a Free Europe. In October, 1950 he was invited by BARBU NICULESCU to attend a meeting of Rumanians presided over by General RADESCU. This meeting was called to organize the Association of Free Rumanians in the United States and charges were made against the Rumanian National Committee and the King's support of that committee. Of all those present, VALAHU was the only one who refused to sign the paper circulated pledging support of the new organization.

"VALAHU states that he was subsequently released from his position at the Voice of America and when applying at the National Committee for a Free Europe he met BARBU NICULESCU who advised him he would have to join the Association of Free Rumanians in the United States before he could get a position at the National Committee for a Free Europe. VALAHU says he again refused to join and thereafter NICULESCU spoke against VALAHU in Rumanian circles."
