7 (SUBJECT INTERVIEW) On 28 January 1955, SUBJECT was interviewed at the American Consulate General, Ludwigstrasse 28, MUNICH 320PU93, Germany and stated in substance:

SUBJECT was born on 1 December 1916 in PRZEMYSL, Poland. Formerly he had Polish citizenship, but he claims to be stateless now. SUBJECT is married and resides at Seehamerstrasse 4, MUNICH, Germany. SUBJECT, a brewer by profession, is a member of the Greek Catholic Church. SUBJECT is in possession of a passport, number 0049613, issued on 7 February 1953 by the City Council, MUNICH, valid until 23 January 1956.

On 9 April 1947 at BERCHTESGADEN 331047, Germany, SUBJECT was married to Helene MALYJ nee SYSTAK, born on 11 January 1922 in OSTROW, Poland. SUBJECT has two (2) children, Irene, born on 19 April 1943 in BISCHOPSWIESEN, near BERCHTESGADEN, and Oleg, born on 11 August 1953 in MUNICH. SUBJECT's father, Peter MALYJ, was a locomotive engineer. He was born in 1870 in LODINKA, Poland, and died in 1933 in PRZEMYSL, Poland. The name of SUBJECT's mother is Katharina MALYJ nee MAKOTA. She was born in 1879 in BOLECHOW, Poland, and resided until the end of hostilities in PRZEMYSL. Since that time SUBJECT has not heard from her. At that time one of SUBJECT's sisters, Maria BATNIK nee MALYJ, born in 1906 in PRZEMYSL, also resided in PRZEMYSL. Four of SUBJECT's brothers reside in Poland, exact address unknown to SUBJECT. They are Wladimir, fifty (50) years old, Stanislaus, forty-six (46) years old, Stefan, forty-two (42) years old, and Tadeus, thirty-four (34) years old. Another brother of SUBJECT, Julian, born on 14 February 1914 in PRZEMYSL, has resided since 1950 in the United States at 3510 West Evergreen Avenue, CHICAGO 5, Illinois. He is employed as a construction engineer.

From 1923 until 1928 SUBJECT attended the elementary school in PRZEMYSL, and, subsequently, he attended the local highschool, from which he was graduated. From 1938 until 1939 SUBJECT studied law at the University of LUBLIN, Poland. From 1946 until 1948 SUBJECT attended the Ukrainian Free University in MUNICH, where he also studied law, but failed to graduate. In 1939 and 1940 SUBJECT was employed in a brewery in LUBLIN to make studies in this field, and he passed a subsequent final examination.

In January 1941 SUBJECT joined the Ukrainian troops, a part of the German Army. From May 1941 until June 1941 SUBJECT received basic training as an infantryman at the training center in NEUHAMMER, near BRESLAU, Polish occupied zone of Germany. Thereafter SUBJECT was as-

signed to the 201st Infantry Division and fought at the Eastern front. In January 1943 SUBJECT was promoted to a 2nd Lieutenant in the German Army. In July 1943 SUBJECT was assigned to the SS (Schutz Staffel-- Protective Corps) Division Galicia, where he served as a battery chief. At this unit SUBJECT was promoted to SS Untersturmfuehrer (Lieutenant). From July until December 1943, SUBJECT was trained as an artilleryman at the army training center in BENESCHAU near PRAHA (PRAGUE), Czechoslovakia (CSR). From January 1944 until May 1944 SUBJECT was at the training center NEUHAMMER again, where he served with 14th Artillery Regiment of the SS Division Galicia. Subsequently, in July 1944, SUBJECT was promoted to SS-Obersturmfuehrer (1st Lieutenant) while serving and fighting at the Eastern front. During the same month SUBJECT and his unit were encircled by the Russians; however, they succeeded in forcing their way through to Hungary. Subsequently SUBJECT served in the German army as an infantryman. In November 1944 SUBJECT was taken prisoner by the Russians; however, he succeeded in escaping at SAMBIR, USSR. SUBJECT proceeded West and in early 1945 he reached STETTIN (SZCZECIN), Poland. SUBJECT stayed there for one year, and in March 1946 he succeeded in reaching BERLIN 3300092, Germany, where he was harbored in a refugee camp located in the English sector of BERLIN. In April 1946 SUBJECT was sent to HAMBURG 32UNE63, Germany, with a refugee train. In July 1946, after his official release from war captivity, which was effected in HAMBURG, SUBJECT went to MUNICH, where he stayed for approximately four (4) weeks. From September 1946 until November 1950 SUBJECT resided in the International Refugee Organization (IRO) camp BERCHTESGADEN, Germany, where he was an officer in charge of the camp police. From January 1951 until March 1951, while residing in the same camp, SUBJECT was unemployed. From April 1951 until December 1951 SUBJECT resided in the IRO camp PELDAPING 32TPU71, Germany, where he was employed as a supply officer until July 1951. Subsequently, until February 1952, SUBJECT was employed in the IRO camp, Funk Kaserno, MUNICH as a storekeeper. Since December 1951, SUBJECT's permanent residence has been in MUNICH. From April 1952 until May 1952, SUBJECT was employed in the United States Warehouse at Landshuterstrasse 128, MUNICH. Since that time SUBJECT has been unemployed.

Due to the fact that SUBJECT sees no prospect of finding an occupation, he has endeavored since 1949 to immigrate with his family to the United States. In 1950 he could not immigrate to the United States because of an alleged lack of visas under the quotas. SUBJECT is in good health and able to work. SUBJECT hopes to work in the United States for the same construction firm that employs his brother Julian. He may reside with his brother, who will pay all travel expenses to the United States for SUBJECT and his family. Otherwise, the United Ukrai-

SUBJECT was, or has been, a member of the following organizations: from 1937 until 1943, the San Football Club and Association; from 1936 until 1943, the Maria Association, a Catholic Ukrainian organization; and from 1946 to the present, the Sicz Ukrainian Sport Club in MUNICH.
