STATE OF EMERGENCY EXTENDED IN HUANUCO, SAN MARTIN

[Excerpts] Lima, 3 Apr (EFE) -- The Peruvian Government today extended for 60 days the state of emergency in the provinces of Huanuco and San Martin Departments, in the Peruvian jungle, north of Lima.

The state of emergency will affect the Tocache Province, San Martin Department, and all provinces except Puerto Inca and Pachitea in Huanuco Department. A decree published today in the official gazette EL PERUANO states that persistent subversive actions perpetrated by terrorists in some provinces of Huanuco and San Martin Departments make it necessary to extend the state of emergency in those areas.

There are political-military commands charged with fighting terrorism in each emergency zone, where drug traffickers are also active.

BELAUNDE TO DISCUSS FALKLANDS AFTER LEAVING OFFICE

[Text] Buenos Aires, 2 Apr (TELAM) -- A report from the REUTER news agency, datelined Lima, Peru, says that Peruvian President Fernando Belaunde Terry has said that when his term in office ends in 4 months, he will reveal the secrets of the Malvinas war. Belaunde made this statement today as Argentina commemorates the third anniversary of the war.

"The Malvinas issue is a problem that will continue to concern Latin America and the world for a long time," Belaunde said at a press conference. He said that the conflict, which ended in a military defeat for Argentina, was solved by force and not by a satisfactory solution despite the peace effort mediations conducted by my government at the proper time.

Belaunde added that he had not said everything about the Malvinas war because of the limitations of his position as president, but those limitations will end in 4 months, he said. In reply to a question, he said that "I will not make any statements about the matter now, but I reserve the right to reveal everything I know when I leave the presidency."

Even though the problem has not been solved, Belaunde still believes that the Peruvian proposal for peace at the time was successful, a proposal appealing for American unity and a vision of the future.

STEEL WORKERS ANNOUNCE INDEFINITE GENERAL STRIKE

[Text] Owing to the unyielding stand taken by the officials of the Peruvian State Iron and Steel Enterprise [Siderperu], who have refused to discuss salary claims for more than 1 and 1/2 months, 5,000 Siderperu workers will today start an indefinite general strike. This announcement was made yesterday by Dr Diosnel Munoz Cordova, an adviser to the Siderperu workers, who stated that the trade union of Siderperu workers and the trade union of Siderperu employees made this decision during a meeting between the leaders of the two unions.
