(U//AIUO) II. SUMMARY OF INVESTIGATIVE ACTIONS

(U/LAIUO) BACKGROUND

1. (U//AIUO) Based on a separate 2008 United States Secret Service investigation that identified an Agency contractor as possessing a degree from a known unaccredited higher education institution, the Office of Inspector General (OIG) initiated a proactive investigation on 5 August 2008 into Agency staff claiming degrees from non-accredited institutions. OIG matched a list of unaccredited institutions against Agency BIO information to identify any individuals who had provided degree evidence to Human Resources. One of the individuals identified, claimed a bachelor's degree from an unaccredited institution, on her Agency BIO.
