Financial records of all transactions of the will be audited by certified public accountants, and in addition, all accounts are available for examination at any time by responsible authorities of the Company.



### HUDGET LEMORANDUM

The attached budget reflects an expansion of executive duties to include a small editorial staff for the purpose of preparing reports in non technical language in the hope that it will improve and expedite utilization of pertinent research findings.
