In resp onse to our inquiry about Albert DUCHSTEIN, born 24 March, 1910 you forwarded to us excerpts a from DOSSIER XE 003306, for which we thank you.

Acording to your record, a preliminary interrogation report filed 30 August 1945 indicates that DUCHSTEIN was arrested by CIC and was to be interrogated by the Third U S Army Intelligence Center on personalities and activities of Amt IV of RSHA that is to say about the personalities and activities of the Nazi Gestapo. We urgently need the interrogation reports on DUC At that time DUCHSTEIN was resisting interrogation and claimed to have been ignorant of the main activities of his former boss and still sought super-war-criminal Heinrich MUELLER, born 28 April 1900 and suspected to have defected to the Russians. DOTATER

We are inclined to believe that somewhere the Army must have a topical file on the RSHA (Reichssicherheitshauptamt -- Reichs Main Security Office) and the Gestapo. There must also be a record of the investigation of the Gestapo and MUELLER and the subsequent search for MUELLER. If there is no such topical collection, then there must be a record of its disposal.

Perhaps these records are in some historical collection or filed in some special war-criminal index.

We suggest that one way to find out whether and how such material was filed might be to trace out Martin BORMANN, HITLER's Deputy, for whom CIC carried on a massive search for/several years after the end of World War II. Conceivably the repository which holds the records of the BORMANN search would hold the records of the search for MUELLER.

Success in locating these archives is of considerable importance in connection with the search for MUELLER and the evaluation of the reliability of a number of currently important persons.
