INTERNATIONAL: Reactions to Human Rights Report

Initial reactions to the Department of State's third annual report on worldwide human rights practices have been moderate.

Many countries seem resigned to the yearly "score-card" while others have tried over the last three years to improve their image. Argentine President Videla, who believes that the report reflected progress in his country on human rights, authorized the translation and publication of the section on Argentina in all local papers. Videla reportedly hopes to end the debate between the US and Argentina on this issue.
