[Redacted] The Argentine Government has apparently granted some wage increases in an attempt to suppress the worst labor problems since the military takeover in March 1976. Railroad workers, who have engaged in sporadic work stoppages in the past week, are returning to their jobs following a pay increase and a government threat of sanctions.

[Redacted] Military and security forces yesterday took control of the strike-bound subway in Buenos Aires. Pilots on the national airline are threatening to resign unless their demands for wage increases are met. In addition, the government-run National Bank was closed yesterday by striking bank workers.
