#### THE FUNCTION OF MONTYOUTING OF FREES AND PROPAGATION INCLUSING OF FORELLON ROMAND

## Report by the Director of Central Intelligence, with the Unanimous Concurrence of the Intelligence Advisory Board

1. During the war, the Federal Communications Commission (FOC) conducted a foreign broadcast intelligence service (FELS), which monitored press and propaganda broadcasts of foreign powers. The FOC was in process of liquidating this agency when its functions was taken over by the Mar Department on an interim basis on 30 December 1955. The Mar Departments requested that the Director of Central Intelligence assume responsibility for the proper disposition of the former FELS function. An <u>ad hop</u> econdities was appointed by C.I.O. action to make this study. Their report has been submitted to the Director of Central Intelligence and the Intelligence Advisory Board.

2. Insed on the recommendations contained in the report of this Enterdepartmential Consister, the unilosed draft directive was prepared as a means of implementing those recommendations.

3. The enclosed directive has been wanninously agreed on by the Director of Central Intelligence and the Intelligence Advisory Board, which included the Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation as a member for consideration of this matter.

4. It is therefore recommended that the National Intelligence Authority approve the draft directive in enclosure A.

Based on the recommendations contained in the report of this Indepartmental Committee and on a thorough review of the problem, it is considered that the operation of this function falls under the provisions of sub-paragraph 3g of the President's Directive of 22 January 1946: "Subject to the existing law, and to the direction and control of the National Intelligence Authority, the Director of Central Intelligence shall \* \* \* \* \* g. perform, for the benefit of said Intelligence Agencies, such service of common concern as the National Intelligence Authority determines can be more efficiently accomplished centrally." The enclosed draft directive was prepared as a means of providing for this central direction under the C.I.C.
