
On 30 September 7 J. ZRCROWN-PEPRIME Chairman for that month, called a meeting of the HTNEIGH Executive Committee at which 7 read a joint ZRCROWN-PEPRIME memorandum in the presence of IRNLUMPIT. In essence this memorandum read:


- s. The ZRCROWN PBPRIME representatives cannot accept the informal memorandum prepared by the HTNEIGH Executive Committee as an enswer to the ZRCROWN-PBPRIME proposals regarding the reorganization and broadening of HTNEIGH.
- b. HTMEIGH memorandum ignores the major points put forth in the joint memorandum read to the Committee by RMLUMPIT in August during which month he was Chairman.
- c. The ZRCROWN-PBPRIME backers gave the Committee 15 days in which to reconsider their stand after which time the ZRCROWN-PBPRIMES will call another meeting to receive HTWEIGH's revised memorandum.

As of this date said meeting has not been called by the ZRCROWN-PBPRIMES. Malament was busy in Geneva on the slave labor matter, and RNLUMPIT has been confined to his bad with a cold following a fortnight's leave. It is expected that the meeting will be called within the next week.

Two days ago [] entertained [] and two of his associates in his home. It was obvious that [] was despondent; in fect, he made the remark that he doubted if he would ever see his homeland again. Subsequent investigation on [] s part developed the following:

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- proposes that we let this matter of broadening and reorganization rest in a state of suspension until That his next meeting with RNCASTING. If RNCASTING sees fit to issue news instructions in writing to ______ Tat that time, the broadening can be pushed in Rome circles. If not, we will simply maintain the pressure on the XNNALEDICT professors just as we have but will go slowly with ______ In order not to force him into the drastic action he has been contemplating.
- I I must confess that the thought of I y's suicide had never entered his mind, but if the old man should take this way out it would probably bring an end to HTMEIGH.
- - who, as the reader knows, will soon be shifted to the staff in SGGRIND in New York. HTNEIGH has not been able to agree upon a replacement for [] and his followers and [] might get together on a candidate but the XNMALWDICT professors are determined to put one of their own men in the spot. In fact, they have been doing some horse trading with [] and he has about agreed to let them have their way. For the umpteenth time. The man they want to put in the job, [], is probably the most radical of the professors' group, next to [] himself.
 - believes the time is right to tell HTMBIGH that since they can no longer get together on the appointment of personnel, the PBPRIMES are disgusted and propose to operate HTGRUBBY much along the lines that JBCRAFT operates. In other words the PBPRIMES will run HTGRUBBY, hiring that KMWAAHOO personnel needed to conduct the operation without regard to political party.
 - b. For some time HTNEIGH leaders have differed over the KMWAAHOO cadre in JBPARSON.

 J would propose that HTNEIGH be told that JBPARSON is being taken over completely by MAGPIE in SGCIDER and that HTNEIGH political leaders no longer have any control or dealings whatsoever with this organization.
 - c. Heretofore HTRETON Propaganda Committee has been treated with the utmost respect by RNLUMPIC and ______. An effort has always been made to suggest rather than demand. The two XNMALEDICT professors (Identities (1) and (2)) have gradually gotten a superior hand and more or less run their associates as they see fit. ______

There are many other little loose bolts here and there which can be tightened to bring the professors down to earth and protect the interests of the other members of HTNEIGH who at the moment will privately concede that HTNEIGH is in reality the Committee for the professors of XNMALEDICT.

Z J would like to repeat that he will take no action along these lines until such action is cleared with higher authority.

Other highlights of the month covered by this report are:

- a. Final material for the slave labor hearings in Geneva was prepared. (Rearings have since been held with Malament acting as spokesman for RTNEIGH, and a press conference is being staged in Rome on this very day.)
 - b. Two issues of QKPALING were published.
 - c. Two issues of KMBUMPSY were published.

L J would caution the reader that this is not intended as a discouraging report. Actually the activities of HTMEIGH are being conducted on an even keel. L J simply wishes to report factually on the state of the political situation which is probably at an all-time high (or low) depending upon how the reader views it.

Attached is a report of activities of the Committee during the period September 10 to October 10, 1952, prepared by the Secretary of HINEIGH.

REPORT ON THE ACTIVITIES OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF THE NCFA DURING THE PERIOD loth SEPTEMBER - loth OCTOBER 1952.-

The Executive Committee of the NCFA held several meetings during this period concerning the following matters:

- 1. Study and discussion of the memorandum presented by the representatives of the backers of the Committee concerning the reorganization and broadening of the NCFA. The Executive Committee has prepared a verbal note on the reorganization, and charged the Secretary of the NCFA to present it to Mr.JL and Mr.AL on the 18th September 52.
- 2. The Committee studied the presentation of the testimony gathered by Mr. Damani, on the Forced Labor Camps of Tepelena, Kamza, Vlogisht and Bishqem, and decided to translate them in English and French for the Hearings of the Ad hoc Committee of the UNO in Geneva.
- The Executive Committee prepared the memorandum which will be presented at the Hearings of the Ad hoc Committee of the UNO in Geneva, on the Forced Labor Camps in Albania.
- 4. The Chairman of the NCFA, exchanged different cables with Mr. Manfred Simon, Secretary of the above mentioned Committee, concerning the possibility of the Hearing of the NCFA on the Forced Labor Camps of Albania, during their next session in Geneva.
- 5. Discussions were held for the replacement of Mr. Ihsan Toptani in Athens.
- 6. Discussions were held for the elements of the political course.
- 7. The note of the backers in reply to the verbal note of the NCFA is being studied.
