

## STATEMENT OF AGREEMENT

1. On December 5, 1951, the following representatives of OPC and OSO met to discuss 1952 operations in Albania:

- 2. The following principles of agreement were reached:
- a. It was determined that both OPC and OSO would maintain close liaison in respect to planning and mounting operations into Albania in 1952.
- b. It was greed that it would be desirable to enlarge NCFA to include individuals not presently represented who could contribute to our operations. It is understood that the men chosen will represent themselves and their presence will not jeopardize the structure and strength of NCFA. The assets they can contribute will be available for immediate operational use. OSO agreed to produce a sterilized account of Charity operations for discussion with the British in respect to changing the British attitude toward Ndue Markageni. OSO will advise the Italian service of the fact that a resume of Charity will be handed to the British.
- c. It was agreed that it would be desirable to eliminate the constant bickering presently going on among all parties both inside and outside NCFA, and efforts should be made to closely coordinate all propaganda to prevent continuance of backbiting.

- d. OPC agreed to OSO's use of the Guard Company as a holding camp although it is understood that OSO does not plan to send more than 10 individuals to the company.
  - e. It was decided that deemphasis of air drops would be mutually advantageous, and further, agreed that the covert plane would not be used for air drops to the exclusion of other methods of infiltration and on a reduced scale in comparison to 1951 operations.
  - 3. It was further agreed and would meet at an early date with and to exchange the outline of 1952 operations.
