#### 3. Objectives and Proposal

To maintain a clandestine radio station for regular broadcasts to Albania in order to keep alive the spirit of passive resistance and hope for eventual freedom, to stimulate popular pressure on the Communist regime, to encourage defection and to promote friction between Albania and other parts of the Soviet orbit.

#### 4. Accomplishments and Effectiveness

During 1955 the radio broadcast four times daily on two frequencies from PYREX facilities. The number of new programs prepared weekly varied from four in the summer to two in the winter, when propagation conditions for broadcasts to Albania are much poorer. Monitoring reports from Italy and northern Greece and intelligence collected from refugees indicate that the broadcasts are audible, in spite of jamming, from March to October. Results of refugee interrogations concerning awareness of the radio have not been very favorable. However, those refugees who had heard, or heard of, the radio commented favorably on its appeal. (It should be noted that most of the refugees are from remote rural areas where very few persons have access to a radio.) It is apparent that the radio has annoyed the regime as Enver Hoxha and Radio Tirana have attacked it by name on several occassions during 1955.

#### 5. Plans

It is planned to continue broadcasts during the coming year at the same level, or at a slightly reduced level, depending on the replacement of indigenous employees who are being processed for emigration. Since it is believed that most of the radio owners are Communists, more emphasis will be given to disaffection and defection themes than to "pressure from below". A change in broadcast format has already been made and will be continued in FY 195. To lessen the disruptive effects of jamming, ten or more brief items are given during each broadcast instead of the lengthier treatment formerly given to three or four topics.

- 1. It is requested that Amendment No. 1 to Project OBTEST be approved in the amount of \$6,800, increasing the project's FY 1957 authorization from \$16,300 to \$23,100, to provide funds for the payment of three additional agents to be used in redirecting the present broadcasting capability to include the development of a program estensibly emanating from Socialists in Exile and playing the so-called National Communist line.
- 2. Project OBTHET was originally approved as a part of Project HOFIEND on 22 June 1949 and was documented and approved as a separate project on 16 July 1954. The objectives of the project as approved under a renewal dated 27 November 1956 are:

"To maintain a clandestine radio station for regular broadcasts to Albania in order to keep alive the spirit of passive resistance and hope for eventual freedom, to stimulate popular pressure on the Communist regime, to encourage defection and to promote friction between Albania and other parts of the Soviet orbit."

- 3. Since approval, the project has been active and the radio, The Voice of Free Albania, currently maintains daily broadcasts with about three new programs each week. Broadcasts are of 16-minute duration four times daily, using two different frequencies simultaneously. Random transmissions have also been employed and these have successfully evaded Albanian jamming. Jamming of the regular broadcasts, although fairly intensive, is relatively ineffective because of the simultaneous transmissions over two frequencies and frequently is evaded by "cuddling" Radio Tirane. The few Rafugee and monitoring reports available to us indicate the programs are clearly audible in Albania. The refugee evaluations of VOFA have been highly favorable during 1956. VOFA has been the subject of several recent attacks by the Albanian regime.
- type radio program in accord with recent revisions of policy regarding clandestine propaganda activity. The program will be designed to appeal to medium and lower level Communist party and government officials through media purporting to emanate from Socialists and Communists who, disillusioned with the present regime, have fled their homoland. This radio will arge less emulation and subservience to the Soviets and will attempt to disrupt and loosen the Moscow-Tirene relationship. Since the largest percentage of Albanians coming radios are Communists, future plans will emphasize the new national communist line and anti-Communist programming will be curtailed.

5. To implement these plans, additional personnel will be required. Following is a brief statement concerning the duties of two of the individuals proposed for use and a short biographical sketch of each one. A third individual has not yet been chosen.

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Born in Yugoslavia on 30 August 1918 of Albanian parents. He speaks Albanian, Serbo-Croatian, Italian, French, German and English. He was employed as a translator by the CID Detachment in Trieste from August 1946 until December 1951. In January 1952 he emigrated to the United States under the suspices of the IRO and with GIA assistance. Effective 1 January 1952 he became a contract agent. He received training duries his stay in the United States and in March 1953 he returned to Inhere he was employed as an interpreter-translator in the [ ] offices. He was transferred to [ ] in November 195h where he was employed until February 1957 under Project OBLONG (FI) to collect operational information and to serve as principal agent for operations under the project. He returned to the United States in February 1955 and his contract was renewed for two years at an annual compensation of Sh. OCC. He is reported by all case officers who have worked with him to be an intelligent well-educated and reliable individual. He has an excellent knowledge of conditions both within Albania and among Albanian exile groups. He is presently in Washington being processed for U. S. citizenship, and career agent status at \$5,440 annually. His clearance (OA) was amended effective 15 March 1957. He will receive further training in Reports, Secret Writing, Paychological Warfare and Tradecraft while he is in the U.S. He will depart for \_\_\_\_\_ about 1 May 1957 where he will serve as principal agent and guide the activities of the three indigenous agents already employed under OBTEST in the development. preparation and production-dissemination of material broadcast on VOFA. He has been serving as critic and editor for scripts for the radio for several months. in addition to his duties under Project OBLONG.

#### b. AIPLIBE

Bern at Korce, Albania, on 18 May 1922. He was formerly a member of the Albanian Communist party who, following his defection to Orecce from Albania in December 195h was used to provide KURARK with cepicus information on Albanian newspapers, radio and the history of the Albanian Communist Party. Before defecting he served as Press Attache in the Albanian Legation in Belgrade in 1966/67, was employed by the Party newspaper, Zeri i Popullit from 1969 to 1953 and was serving in the Press Office of Radio Tirans until a few weeks prior to his defection. He fell into disfavor with the Party, lost his membership and was jailed in 1967 for having married a non-proleterian Tugoelav woman. He has been polygraphed and an OA was granted on 18 March 1957 granting use of subject as a writer-ennouncer for the Mational Communist type radio. His clearance is subject to periodic check and another technical interrogation within a year. He is considered highly intelligent, and reliable to a satisfactory degree for the job he will be performing.
