### a. Action Reported by the Field

- 1. The radio went on a new schedule 15 Getober which includes less broadcast time, but has the advantage of a 1700 GMT broadcast on Monday and Vednesdays that duddles the Radio Tirane News broadcast on both sides. Radio Tirane 1900 GMT newscasts continue to be suddled every evening.
- 2. Attempts to secure permission from HBMADDOCK to attempt to recruit AIPLESE continue.

### b. Pending Action

- 1. Until AICOMB or AIPLESE may be added to the staff, drastic revisions toward a "Mational Communist" radio will be impractical, particularly with the current personnel shortage.
- 2. AIREN will depart for the United States soon after AIPOET's return to Athens the latter part of November.

#### c. Evaluation

1. A former Albanian Communist and Army captain states that HTGRUBST is widely listened to in Albania, especially among discontented party members. He credits the radio with influencing a number of communists such as Gen. Hulusiu SPAHIU in protesting economic conditions which resulted in the latter's expulsion from his position. The Captain complimented the radio's "understanding" and sautioned against prematurely inciting the populace. He also felt there should be a new program every day rather than only 3 or 4 per week.
