HATOYAMA Ichiro's illness will prevent him from taking an active part in politics in the next three or four years. Since YOSHIDA Shigeru is unwilling to stay in office for that length of time, he and HATOYAMA have decided to turn the leadership of the Liberal Party over to OCATA Taketora. A year after the ratification of the Treaty YOSHIDA will call a general election and name OGATA as his successor. OGATA will be depurged very soon. Will not take any immediate part in politics. Is being urged to travel abread, to study the international situation at first-hand and to prepare himself for his responsibilities. (ZJL-669, 12 July 1951,

Hitoshi TAKAHASHI on May 7 in Hong Kong denied reports that he has been contacting Third Force Leaders in Hongkong in an official capacity.

TAKAHASHI represents Taketora OGATA and is in Hong Kong to make preparations for the latter's trip to the Colony. It is also reported that, in conversation with Gen. HSU Tsung-tse, he has intermal indicated that Japanese authorities would offer assistance in China's so-called democracy and freedom movement. Contacted by PANASIA, he denied the reports, saying that he is a private businessman. He is slated to return to Japan May 28. Informed sources in Hong Kong, stating that although he is not believed to be connected with OGATA, he is working for Japan's International Military Research Institute. (FBIS, Hong Kong, PANASIA, 7 May 1952).

Foreign Office said attention given OGATA due possibility he might succeed YOSHIDA as Japanese Premier but nothing concrete came from his talks here. He told press that Japan wished develop trade with SE Asia so as sell industrial output there if Chinese mainland cut off, that SE Asia political alliance unnecessary as prosperity thru economic cooperation would offset Communism, that Japan planned call economic confab at Tokyo if sufficient support given and that internal security and military strength of Formosa impressive. Appointment was not forthcoming due to pressure on YOSHIDA exercised by leading members of the Liberal Party who accused OGATA of advocating close cooperation with Taiwan because of a bribe received from the Gimo.
