One of the primary reasons for OGATA's loss of power has been the strong newspaper opposition to him. OGATA visited Formosa in the fall of 1953 and was described as President of the Governing Board of the Asahi Shimbun. FCTA-7184, 6 Jun 55

JAPA 2769 (IN 47706), 27 May 1955 contains very good summary of ODOPAL reports linking OGATA with nationalist groups and formation of organizations to support his political position (this technique referred to as "leadership principle", an apparent well-used and traditional method in Japan) The cable weighs the pros and cons, admits possibility of truth but believe that OGATA's recent attitude toward U.S. indictes reports not of value.

OGATA Taketora (2)

It is interesting to note that OGATA was a pioneer in the TOYAMA Mitsuru organization (1937) aimed at advocating a one-party system similar to that of Germany and Italy. This organization gave rise to the I.R.A.A. (of which OGATA was Vice-President); The previously mentioned cable contained a B-2 report, among others of a similar nature, that in 1952 OGATA was engaged in a movement for the rebirth of TOYAMA's organization.

FJB-478, late Oct 1954 described OGATA as Director General of the Hokkaido Development Agency.
