a. Upper House Opens Budget Hearings: The House of Councillors Budget Committee on 18 July opened hearings on the budget bill which had passed the Lower House the previous day....				
Comment. Although the probable support of Liberals, Progressives and Green Breeze Society members gives the draft budget sufficient potential votes for passage in the Upper House, extended arguments on technicalities are likely. The Socialists have questioned the degree to which the Diet may revise a government budget draft and have asked who will take responsibility for answering questions on the revised portions. Deputy Prime Minister <u>OGATA Taketora</u> indicated that the government would let the party which had proposed the revisions (The Progressives) respond to questions on the revisions, although the government would assume responsibility for following provisions of the budget once it is enacted.....
