NATIONAL DEFENSE			
Deputy Prime Minister <u>OGATA</u> —on a Hokkaido canvassing tour—informed reporters last night: "The National Safety Force at its present strength will not suffice when the Security Forces withdraw. The government will deliberate on a plan to increase NSF personnel by 20,000 to 40,000 men." This climaxed an earlier press conference which set off a chain-reaction among opposition party politicians. (a) "At present the positive plan calls for increasing the NSF to 150,000 by the volunteer system," OGATA declared earlier. "The negative plan calls for increasing the force to 130,000. We want to consider an increase of 20,000 land forces in next year's budget...The NSF is not a war potential and revising the Constitution is not necessary. The Prime Minister's ideas have not changed at all."
