<p>3. TANAKA (Tanekichi) (3944/0022/4467/0679) came to Japan in June 1953 on YI's (Maj. Gen. YI Sam-song) orders to contact pro-Korean Japanese and secure funds for the Third Party operation. YI had bought 500 tons of copper ingots at ¥50,000 per ton in Korea, and he was hoping to sell them in Japan at ¥300,000 per ton. As a result of negotiations with Deputy Premier <u>OGATA Taketora</u>, TANAKA obtained an understanding from the Japanese Ministry of International Trade and Industry (MITI) that the copper would be handled as unallocated goods. YI decided to ship the 500 tons of ingots from Pusan to Hiroshima on an American 8th Army ship about the middle of September.</p> <p>4. <u>Field Comment</u>. 'Unallocated goods' presumably means that no authorization for foreign currency exchange is needed.</p>
