NATIONAL DEFENSE				
The Lower House Foreign Affairs Committee yesterday put off approval of the four MSA agreements. The delay occurred because Deputy Prime Minister OGATA failed to show up at the night session. The agreements, committing Japan to a speedier defense buildup, will come up for a formal committee vote today....

The relation between defense action and the Constitution also came up for discussion. Deputy Prime Minister <u>OGATA</u> told the committee that Japanese troops can go overseas to fight "unjustifiable sudden aggression" without violating the Constitution. OGATA cited two othertypes of authorized defense. He said the Constitution permits Japanese defenders to 1) support UN operations from rear bases and 2) serve under UN or US commanders "after severance from the National Safety Force."
