Probe Violation of Mail Secrecy: Deputy Prime Minister <u>OGATA</u>, Judicial Affairs Minister <u>INUKAI</u> and Postal Minister <u>TSUKADA</u> have admitted before the Diet that Public Security Investigation Agency (PSIA) personnel questioned postmen regarding mail deliveries. Left-Wing Socialists raised the charge, following a letter to a major newspaper claiming that men representing themselves as PSIA personnel had stopped postmen in Ueda City, Nagano Prefecture to inquire about letters and parcels addressed to specified individuals, <u>OGATA</u> told a Diet committee that the government had investigated the case, reprimanded PSIA, and warned against such actions in the future...<u>OGATA</u>, answering a Left-wing Socialist interpellator, said that contents of correspondence had not been revealed, but admitted that the case "may constitute a violation" of the Constitution.
