SUBJECT: Identification of Alleged U.S. Agent.

His wife, IVANKA, from whom he may be separated, allegedly was in close contact with pro-Axis elements in Yugoslavia, during World War II. Another source reported in 1945 that she had been loyal to the Allies.

b ERICH OLERUCK - According to a report dated 9 March 1953, subject was a German Reserve Officer who later became an SS Sturmabfuhrer in the Reich's Sicherheits Hauptamt (World War II German Intelligence Organization). He is presently suspected of working as an agent for German Intelligence. In early 1952, he came to Egypt as the representative of a Swiss export firm.
