b ERICH OLDRUCK - According to a report dated 9 March 1953, subject was a German Reserve Officer who later became an SS Sturmbalm-fuehrer in the Reich's Sieherheits Hauptampt (World War II German Intelligence Organization). He is presently suspected of working as an agent for German Intelligence. In early 1952, he came to Egypt as the representative of a Swiss export firm.
