SUBJECT: Identification of Alleged U.S. Agent.

- 1. Reference is made to R-219-53, partidularly paragraph 5, thereof.
- 2. Colonel Kurt FERCHAL and Major Gerhard Georg MERTIMS, German military experts in Egypt, insist that some of their activities have been directed by a man named ERICH OLERUCK (OLERUECK). Included in these activities are MERTINS' connections with SALAH, son of the Grand Mufti of Jerusalem, to probe the activities of the Grand Mufti, and connections with the brother of HASSAN MAHMOUD (until recently Chief of Staff, Egyptian Air Force).

- 3. These officers 12 assert that OLERUCK is a highly competent intelligence agent well known for his smooth operation. OLERUCK has produced documents to prove that he is an agent for the BONN Government and American "S-2".
- 4. Officers! doubts as to the authenticity of OLBRUCK became aroused when they found they were being criticized by Western representatives of having the connections ordered by OLBRUCK.
- 5. On 24 July, MERTINS stated the agent's name to be a Mr. MAPPLEBECK, a British resident of Egypt engaged in Import-Export work. On 28 July, FERCHL and MERTINS said MAPPLEBECK is involved but the real agent is ARICH OLERUCK. The officers asked if the undersigned could re-assure them that OLBRUCK is what he represents himself to be.
- 6. Local CAS sources held the following information on these alleged agents:
- a. Thomas G. MAPPLEBECK In 1948 suspected of being a member of British Intelligence. Lived in Yugoslavia from 1922-1938.
