Is there any interest at Headquarters in the activities of <u>Erich M. OLERUCH aka Heinrich ADMAN aka Erich PONS</u>. DOR 20 January 1911 in Breslau, Germany, and the subject of references? <input checked="" type="checkbox"/> believes Subject's residence in the Sudan (since January 1959) may be under the sponsorship of <u>WEST GERMAN UPSWING</u>. <input checked="" type="checkbox"/> OLERUCH alleges that he was one of the youngest generals in the Wehrmacht during World War II. <input checked="" type="checkbox"/> bases the aforementioned belief on the following:</p> <p>a. While OLERUCH by his own admission has not made a nickel in the Sudan, he lives handsomely with a minimum monthly outlay of \$900. Peculiarly, Subject seems more concerned about his ability to stay in the Sudan than his inability to make money here.</p> <p>b. OLERUCH makes frequent trips in and out of the Sudan and has a wide circle of friends, especially Sudanese.</p> <p>c. Recently the GCS expressed unwillingness to renew Subject's visa since his business activities had been unproductive, and of no benefit to the Sudan. According to Subject's wife, in order to remain here, OLERUCH formed an "inactive company" with the local owners of the Pepsi Cola Company (LIMNOS Bros) to promote industrial projects in the Sudan. Mrs. OLERUCH says her husband probably will make no money from this venture but "at least it keeps us in the Sudan". She claims OLERUCH made the connection with the LIMNOS brothers (Greeks) through the good offices of the West German Embassy.</p> <p>d. OLERUCH's closest friend here has been <u>Richard POHL</u>, the Commercial and Cultural Attache of the West German Embassy. POHL left Khartoum recently and unexpectedly after having been reassigned for an additional two year tour of duty.</p> <p>2. <input checked="" type="checkbox"/> provided the following additional information on OLERUCH: he is married to a German widow and has a step-son and daughter. The son is a student in a German university and the daughter is married to the son of the well-known Moroccan rebel, Abdel Karim, and now resides in Cairo, Egypt. Subject carries passport number 9447274 (Federal Republic of Germany). He is suffering from a stomach disorder and fragmentation wounds received during World War II. He and his wife, Edith, plan to leave the Sudan for a vacation and medical treatments in Germany sometime this month. The Olbruchs and <input checked="" type="checkbox"/> are good friends.
