<p>FYI and Records</p> <p>A. EGMW-12044, 17 July 1962 [] has no record of having received this document)</p> <p>B. EGMW-13095, 7 June 1963</p> <p>1. [] has the following information on Subject obtained by local investigation conducted by a usually reliable source in mid-1960 which may be passed to ACSI if desired:</p> <p>A. Subject is approximately 53 years old (a/o 1960), 6'2" tall, weight about 240 lbs., balding, blue eyes, and powerfully built. He has been resident in Sudan since January 1959, arriving here from Egypt, where he is reported to have lived for three years. His permanent residence is Munich. A member of the German Army during World War II, Subject is reported to have reached the rank of General and to have been one of the youngest officers to reach that rank. He took part in the North African and European campaigns.</p> <p>B. Subject is married to a German widow, who appears to be of about Subject's age, and has a step-son and daughter. In 1960 the step-son was reportedly a student at an unspecified German University. The step-daughter is reportedly the wife of the son of the famed Moroccan Riff leader, Abd-al-Karim and resides in Cairo.</p> <p>C. In 1960 Subject lived in a house which rented for \$275.00 per month (although high, this price was not and is not considered exorbitant rent for acceptable European style housing in Khartoum), and to having expenses averaging approximately \$900.00 per month. As of the date of this dispatch, Subject is widely known in Khartoum and generally considered by all to be an officer of the West German IS. His closest associations are with</p>

<p>high-ranking police officers, several of whom have few or no European associates other than those with whom they have liaison dealings. Subject is also very close to the present Minister of Commerce, Industry and Supply, Major General Maqbul al-Amin al-Haj who formerly held the post of Minister of Interior. Subject reportedly accompanied General Maqbul, when he was still Minister of Interior, on a trip to Munich in late 1961 or early 1962. The purpose of Maqbul's trip was to check on the progress of several Sudanese policemen then studying in Munich. Upon his return, Subject is reported to have said that he was responsible for escorting Maqbul in Munich and for arranging his itinerary.</p>		
<p>D. In June 1962 Subject was instrumental in arranging for the sale to the GOS of 600,000 Sudanese pounds worth of communications equipment. The German firm of Standard Elektrik, Lorenz of Stuttgart supplied the equipment. Subject is reliably reported to have received a commission of DM 41,700 for his efforts in this transaction.</p>		
<p>2. The following may <u>not</u> be passed to ACSI:</p>		
<p>Subject has been seen in the company of QPSNAG/3 (liaison) and several of his subordinates. None of these men, but particularly QPSNAG/3, have any European friends who are not in some official liaison with them. In conjunction with the various other factors which indicate Subject's IS connections, this fact virtually convinces [] that Subject is indeed West German IS. That Subject is, as stated in Reference B, "technical adviser to the Sudanese Intelligence Service," [] doubts, however. There are just not enough technical operations conducted by the Sudanese to warrant such an adviser. It appears more likely that Subject acts in a liaison capacity with the Sudanese, arranging for training, both straight police and intelligence type, and performing other normal liaison functions.</p>		
<p>3. [] would appreciate receipt of any further information on Subject as he is a definite factor in the Khartoum operational scene.</p>
