In reference to leapatch No. 11902 from Berne, June 12, 1945, SH No. 45, the following information on personalities mentioned thereis may be of interest:

therein may be of interest:

ANGERER, Joseph., Address: Clisabethstrasse 13, Lichterfelde steglits, Rerlin 41. Mamber of the firm of QUANTENEYER und KICHE, Yohrenstrasse, Perlin, which he uses as a cover for his intelligence activities. To was sent to Vienna from Belgrade in April, 1941, to report personally to Goering for special orders. He is said to belong to the 3D and to have engaged in fifth column work in Persia before the Allied occupation. He is also reported to have been in Turkey, ostensibly on an official commercial mission in 1942.

POLIAN, "ichel, alias OLIANOF; of Esthonian or Letvian origin, reported to come from Rigs. Fought in the White Russian armies against the Rolsheviks after the last war. Last known address; Hotel des Bergues, Adoneva, Switzerland.

OLIAN was suspented by the British of surrency amuggling and of being a German agent early in the war and came to Geneva from Paris soon after the war's outbreak. We is a becallist in foreign exchange transactions and in the unfreezing of frozen assets in the United States. Forty-five millions of atolem money which the Hazi leaders drained from the German people are deposited in a Testern Swiss bank in his name.

Around 1942 OLIAH was reported to be coming to Paris with the help of LRHARD, an attorney of Paris and Geneva (Paris address: 14 rue de Karignan), who added sollaborators in getting back to France and was said to be "homme de confisnce" of Anatole de MOMZIE.

Most recently we have also learned the following about OLIAM from a highly reliable source: He was working for the High Command of the German Army in some association with you KAISER, Chief of the Finance Division, but was compelled to liquidate his undertakings in Switzerland after he was placed on the English and American black lists.

OLIAN's wife is the sister of a certain Nicolaus PREUDENSTRIM who was to be deported by the Masis from Prance to the Rast because of his presumed Jewish origin. A Dr. SCHEFFER (first name unknown) of Geneva would appear to be close to OLIAN and informed of his activities, since it was the former who interceded for OLIAN with the Germans in the matter of FREUDENSTRIM's deportation. SCHEFFER is a retired mining official, aged 62, who lived in Faris from 1926 until 1938 when he moved to Geneva. In 1941 he was in Prance on some special mission for the chiefs of the armistice

commission. He is a member of the German colony in Switserland (membership card #1694) and is proud of his and his many brothers' participation in national-socialist affairs.

BUNDORF, Max Adolf, (probably identical with Max BUNDORF mentioned on Pege 3 of Despatch No. 11902). Roumanian. Born Cernauti 1910. Passport: Rumanian, #21208/342298 issued Bucharest 15/11/1941. Residence: Taksim, Mote cad. Suren Apt. 15, Istanbul. Employment: Merchant. Office: Gelata, Hudsvenidigiar Han, 56/75/74. He is a merchant in import-export and does business with the Germans. Reported to be still in Istanbul in 1944.
