Adolf Hitler, a German national, succeeded to Siemons,  
and he, with Kaiser's assistance during General assemblies,  
had the accounts of the company examined by experts.

Believing the moment propitious Kaiser provoked fric-  
tions between H. Hurdon, a Director, and Leroux, President  
and General Manager, on the one hand, and the occupying  
forces of the other hand, giving the latter information  
concerning the business.

Aside from the above activities, Kaiser is said to  
have been a broadcaster of radio and to German broadcasts  
and to have written for a newspaper "L'Echo de Paris".

Kaiser's present resources are unknown, except for the  
dividends he received from Hurdon stock which is estimated  
at about 20,000 francs a year.

In his surroundings Kaiser is said to be a doubtful  
character and very nervous in regard to his locality.

The references in Kaiser's attention has never been  
drawn with regard to his political or national activities.

His name does not appear in the judicial records.

3 - Michel HURON - FRANÇOIS HURON?

Michel Huron was born July 27, 1897 in Riga, Latvia,  
son of Leon Huron and Marie Zuzit, of Russian nationality  
(Card of Identity No. 112, 2, 246). He was married in Berlin  
on July 10, 1922 to Elizabeth Brandenstein, born September  
13, 1892 in Stuttgart, daughter of Gustave and Marie Kaplan.

A daughter, Yvonne, born November 24, 1924 in Paris  
was recently married in Luxembourg.

It is recalled that the above mentioned names he  
has been mentioned in the past as being in contact with  
certain persons in Luxembourg, notably with Jean Bouvier  
in connection with the activities of the latter in the  
Paris area and with the return of the latter to  
Paris. He is said to have been in contact with the  
latter in the following circumstances: At the end of the  
occupation of Luxembourg, the latter was in contact with  
Huron and his wife, and with the latter's friend, Jean  
Munbey.

From 1926 to 1936 he resided at 11 bis Rue de Vezeley, 17 Rue de l'Amoeliation, 40bis Rue Reynouard, 54 Boulevard Souchet, devenue Lozard and, from 1935 to 1939, 12 Rue de Clugny, Paris.

Ollan has had various professions. In 1928 he pretended to be a commission agent and made extensive exchange speculations; later he became an associate of the firm Goldwasser, 18 Rue Carivau, Paris (no longer in existence).

Thereafter he was the manager of the Societe Civile Immobiliere (real estate transactions), founded February 21, 1930, appearing on the Commerce register of the Seine under No. 894,738.

Madame Ollan who shared her husband's business life and a very irregular life, she is said to have had numerous foreign lovers who visited her at her domicile. Prior to 1940 she made numerous trips to England, Germany and Switzerland under almost various pretexts.

Ollan also made various trips to England, Scotland, etc. He stopped at Interstream 87, and to Scotland. He was there when the ship broke out in 1932, and he was summoned by the Ministry of National Defense of being in contact in connection for a foreign agent.

He has been in close contact with one of the main figures of the French Resistance, national policy.

He was the subject of an expulsion order dated March 12, 1930, for exchange speculations, but was permitted to benefit from the results of quarterly auctions. This order was cancelled March 9, 1933.

Ollan's official record is as follows: conviction on April 15, 1928, notification No. 327 - 1 month suspended, 500 Francs - (12th). November 1939 for violation monopoly of telegraphic transmissions.

4 - Public Notes (or notes)

He records Marie Roger, wife of Roger, son of Marie Maurice Roger 2025, born [redacted] son of Alfred Maurice Marie Alphonse, [redacted] has three children, lives at 12 Avenue [redacted] private house which he owns. No connection with the Bureau de la Bourgeoisie.

He claims to be a company director and is said to have had commercial dealings with the Germans.

During the occupation he had, possibly, used four automobiles. He bought last year the house in which he lives for Frs. 4,500,000, and is said to have had Frs. 5,000,000 worth of repairs made.
