The following information was taken verbatim from the above referenced document.

<p>25. We then passed to the discussion of other matters, discussing generally other interesting personalities whom subject knew. Important among these was our old friend, Michel <u>OLLIAN</u> (WFP-5778). Subject dragged <u>OLLIAN</u> into the conversation rather extraneously, we felt. It developed that subject first met <u>OLLIAN</u> in Geneva some ten years ago, at which time <u>OLLIAN</u> contacted subject regarding the purchase at auction of certain jewelry belonging to an estate that was being liquidated, <u>OLLIAN</u> proposed to subject that subject appraise the jewelry offered. It is developed that the jewelry was worth the price asked, subject and <u>OLLIAN</u> would buy it together. Acting in good faith, subject made a thorough appraisal of all jewelry offered, telling <u>OLLIAN</u> that it was well-worth the asking price. <u>OLLIAN</u> then turned around and bought the jewelry without cutting subject in. As a result, subject feels very bitter towards <u>OLLIAN</u>, whom he describes as the worst kind of crook.</p>				
<p>24. Subject told us, as [ ] had before, about <u>OLLIAN</u>'s purchase of an Italian passport which he bragged about pre-maturely and then lost.</p>				
<p>25. We were immediately suspicious of subject's motivation for raising <u>OLLIAN</u>'s name, particularly since we had recently been visited by AL <u>FRENGLER</u>, the new Regional Security Officer at Paris. <u>FRENGLER</u> had told us that he had just come from Rome, where a tremendous case was being prepared against <u>OLLIAN</u>. At that time <u>FRENGLER</u> asked us for all of the material on <u>OLLIAN</u> which existed either in Geneva or in Bern. <u>FRENGLER</u> professed not to know anything about the case and said that he had simply been asked to try to coordinate with Bern, Geneva and Paris. It was quite obvious that the Regional Security Officer would not come into the case unless one or more American officials was involved. It occurred</p>
