- 1. Attached for all addressees is a brief report on the Hamburg Kuenast Chief, Paul OPITZ, volunteered by meeting held with him 16 April 1958.
- 2. Frankfurt traces on the personalities mentioned in the Attachment are as follows:
  - a. Paul OPITZ: EGEA 266, 6 March 1953 reporting he formerly the director of the Kuenast In Hamburg.

EGGA-104, 14 March 1955 is proposal of contact.

EGGA-127, 25 March 1955 states contact established.

EGGA-208 and 209, 21 May 1955; EGGW-4, 5 May 1955 and EGGW 8, 15 July 1955 are concerned with unfavorable Headquarters traces on him.

EGGA 242, 16 June 1955 reports he is responsible to the BfV for sabotage/espionage on north German coast.

SUBJECT: Paul OPITZ, Chief of the Hamburg Kuenast

1. Treported that Paul *OPITZ (born 17 September 1897 in Bad Schmiedeberg/Kreis Wittenberg) Chief of the Hamburg Kuenast, is in a disgruntled state of mind.

At the present \( \subseteq \text{could only report that OPITZ} \) is an old intelligence hand ('\( \text{bin alter Abwehr-Hase''} \), and \( \subseteq \subseteq \text{suspects that he was actually a member of the RSHA during the National Socialist regime, \( \subseteq \subseteq \text{also believes that at that time OPITZ held Beamter status, as a result of which he receives a pension because of his advanced age; \( \subseteq \subseteq \text{could only state he was over 65 years, and at the moment does not even know OPITZ's first name.} \)

personally, since it is useless to make inquiries on Kuenast matters with the Hamburg LfV, with both of whom claims excellent relations) about in the first week of April 1958, OPETZ was relating his financial and professional wees, and allegedly observed that if "they" wanted to cut his pension, he ought to tell "them" all to goto the devil, since he had frequent and interesting contact with "the Americans", and they would jolly well pay OPITZ well for what he could do for them. and there would be no opportunity for a pension cut for that work states OPITZ has no family, and appears to be incredibly conscientious and competent intelligence officer, working from early morning until late at night, often to midnight and later, with scarcely a break. OPITZ allegedly expressed to a personal liking for those Americans withwhom he dealt professionally, drew an unfavorable comparison to the BfV between its members and the sobriety and level-headedness of these Americans, and complimented the Americans' method of doing things with thoroughness and competence.
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
