It is further understood that SUBJECT will continue to be utilized under Project AERODYNAMIC in the preparation of radio scripts and newspaper articles.

- 2. In accordance with the provisions set forth in Clandestine Services Instruction No. 10-5 and Clandestine Services Instruction Field No. 10-5, a covert security approval is granted for the use of the SUBJECT, as described in your request as set forth in paragraph 1, above.
- 3. Subjects of covert security approvals are not to represent themselves as, nor are they to be represented as, employees of  ${\tt CIA}$  .
- 4. Your attention is called to the fact that a covert security approval does not constitute complete compliance with the provisions of CIA Regulation 10-210. Therefore, if you should desire at a later date to change the status or use of this individual, a request for approval to cover any proposed change should be submitted to this office.
- 5. This approval becomes invalid in the event the SUBJECT'S services are not utilized within six months of the date of this memorandum.
