5. Cassal telephoned Richard Helms and handed the phone to(b)(3)related the story to Helms and was told to call the(b)(3)police. Helms stated that he would have Sheffield Edwards (then(b)(3)D/OS) respond to the scene.was told by Helms to "Tell thetruth. Don't try to avoid anything."(b)(3)

6. The DC Police arrived in the form of Lawrence Hartnett.
He was told by \_\_\_\_\_\_ that Subject had worked for CIA. The (b)(3) detective did not know what CIA was and confused it with the Civil Aviation Authority (CAA). \_\_\_\_\_\_ admits the detective didn't have a (b)(3) clue as to what was going on and came near arresting hin and Cassal. He frankly remarked that he thought the detective wasn't "a very bright bulb."

7. Edwards and Paul Gaynor, after a certain amount confusion, convinced the police that Cassal and were no longer needed on (b)(3) the scene. recalls that the police brought the suicide note (b)(3) down from the bedroom and Edwards took custody of the note for Helms. believes Cassal told him that Helms had said the note (b)(3) said "They're after me."
