BODY OF YUGOSLAV FRONTIER GUARD, KILLED BY GREEK PLANE IN BELGRADE (Minister Zujovic delivers eulogy) moday, large crowds of Belgrade inhabitants paid tribute to the dead remains of the soldier Milos Jankovic who on June 13 fell victim as a result of the Greek menarchofuscist attack on our territory. Sroten Zujovic, Minister of Federal Government, delivering oulogy stressed that the foundations of the new Yugoslavia are built on the precious blood and lives of conscious people, builders of a new life. One of such people, he said, was Miles Jankovic, who gave his life for his fatherland. Minister Zujovic further pointed out that the provocatory attacks against the new Yugoslavia were not only uttacks ggainst the new Yugoslavia, i.e. against its security. they were attacks against peace and security in He said, the world. Those who are carrying out these attacks, he said, are enemies of peace of the whole world. The attack on our frontier shows one more thing: It is intentional maintaining of an atmosphere of tension and threatening of peaceful relations, an intentional provocation and cause of clashes. The circumstances, under which the attack was carried out, indisputably prove the guilt and responsibility of the attackers. The attack on our policy reveals before the eyes of the whole world the provocatory policy of the present rulers of Greece, not only towards Yugoslavia, but also toward peace in general. This, still further exposes the foreign imperialists who are helping such a provocatory policy. This attack clearly shows that the Wonarchofascists are only a weapon of warmongers. Minister Zujovic pointed to the fact that this attack and Jankovic's death are a warning to us to be still more watchful and to guard our frontiers and our country's freedom even more than heretofore, "The death of our comrade," said Minister Zujovic, "is a warning to our enemies to watch out and not to think that they will easily provoke Yugoslavia, and especially that they will inflict any damage to Yugoslavia. The United Nations must use its authority in preventing the work of the monarchofascist provocateurs and imperialists who help them."

PERSECUTION OF DEMOCRATS IN GREECE CONTINUES

New York: The general secretary of the Democratic Lawyers Association, Popper, published a letter written by four Greek lawyers in which the Greek Government is being accused of bestial persecutions of the Greek democrats. The authors of the letter were arrested during a raid in Athens on April 3rd and 4th of this year. Then the police arrested 571 persons, including many scientists, professors, physicians, lawyers, contractors and trade union leaders. These persons were deported without trial to the island of Nicaria. In the letter it was said that the police did not find any proof of guilt among the arrested persons and that they were arrested only because of their democratic tendancies. The letter was secretly smuggled from the island of Nicaria to the president of the Democratic Lawyers Association, the French professor Cassen.

NOTORIOUS NAZI RELEASED FROM KLAGENFURT JAIL

Klagenfurt: Tanjug's correspondent reports that Ernest Kolenik, the notorious Nazi from Lodenberg, who was known by his Nazi activity even during the first Austrian Republic when he was leader of the local Nazi organization, has been released from Klagenfurt jail. He later became a leading personality among the Nazis in Lodenberg. The Klagenfurt court condemned this notorious Nazi to one year prison term and confiscation of property, but he was immediately set free under the well known pretext that he is not in a condition to be in prison because of illness.

TEXT OF ALBANIAN NOTE TO GREAT BRITAIN

Tirana: The Albanian Minister to Belgrade, Mr. Tuk Jakov, according to the Albanian Telegraph Agency has delivered to British Ambassador Peake a note of the Government of PR Albania with a request that latter send it to his government.

"Since February 13th, 1945," the Albanian note states, among other things, "the Albanian Central Commission for War Criminals several times turned to the UN War Crimes Commission in London. The Albanian Government demands in the name of the Albanian people that Albanian and foreign criminals, who committed numerous crimes in Albania, be handed over." The note complains that so far nothing has been done in this respect.

Stressing that the Albanian claims concerning the handing over of war criminals is in full harmony with the Allied decisions, the Albanian Government in its note stresses that the majority of Albanian war criminals and collaborationists requested by the Albanian Government, are now living in Italy and Greece and in the American and British occupation zones of Germany.

Dealing with the great and numerous crimes committed by persons of Albanian origin whose extradition is being requested, the Albanian Government stresses that they are now endeavoring to hide under the mask of political refugees and to continue their criminal activity against Albania and against peace and security.

The Government of PR Albania expressed the conviction that the British Government in the interest of peace in the world and with the aim of carrying out the principles of justice in international relations will undertake measures that this justified Albania's claim be properly and quickly satisfied.

The Albanian Minister Plenipotentiary delivered an identical note to the U.S. Charge d'Affaires with request +e send it to the US Government.

YUGOSLAV VERSION OF CAPODISTRIA INCIDENT


