## GERMAN FUGITIVES FROM FRENCH MOROCCO IN MADRID

The Germans mentioned were proceeding from Morocco. They had succeeded to flee from a concentration camp in French Morocco from where they went to Spanish Morocco. Their stay in Madrid is in transit and they are going to Nanclares de la Oca.

Opposing all dispositions which in the interior govern the stay of prisoners in transit, these Germans were installed in a special department. On order of the chief of the prison, on the arrival of the transit Germans, Spanish prisoners were turned out of their bunks so that the Germans could use them. They were lodged with full honors. Spanish prisoners remained on the floor.

Immediately on the arrival of the mentioned Germans, they were put in contact with the prisoner Julio GARCIA Aguilar, ex-divisionario of the Division Azul (Blue Division) and hidden in the Madrid prison in order to escape foreign reclamation for the following deed: assassination, with motives of robbery, of a Bulgarian diplomat, his wife, and his brother-in-law, which was carried out with the aid of two other Hungarians belonging also to a Division of Volunteers in the German army. The act occured in Stuka, in 1943.

Julio GARCIA Aguilar, most proficient in the German language, had a long conversation with the new arrivals. They told him that it is only for a short time that they are being moved to Nanclares de la Oca. Only in order to cover up a mere proceeding. It is agreed with the authorities at Morocco that they will enter into the Foreign Legion. They stated that shortly a new expedition of fugitives from French Morocco will arrive. It appears they have a service of fugitives organized in the concentration camp with the aid of Spaniards from Spanish Morocco.

As is evident in the papers of the Germans who have arrived, one of them, whose name our informed was not able to specify, is wanted by a court of justice at Frankfurt.
