1. There is no specific derogatory information available on Radekav OSTROWSKI. Most of the derogatory comments about him come from opposition Belarusians of the BNR (Belorussian National Rada). The BNR members castigate him because of his war-time collaboration with the Nazis under whose auspices he established the Belarusian Central Rada. The latter organization still insists that it is the only authorized representative of Belorussian national interests. Currently OSTROWSKI has associated himself with a somewhat shady character by the name of Lt. Col. LAFONT (real name Ladislav CHMOROWICZ), a former prosecutor in the NKVD, and now "Chief of Staff" of the Belarusian Liberation Movement.

2. There is no information in our files regarding OSTROWSKI's activities between the years 1948 and 1950. In July 1950 he was in London, England at which time he helped to organize the EWR (Belorussian Liberation Movement) in collaboration with the above-mentioned Lt. Col. LAFONT. OSTROWSKI then went to Argentina and remained there until 1952. In July 1952 he showed up in Germany and since that time has given Langenfeld/Chlde, Volksgrarterstr. 1 as his address. Since his return to Germany, he has spent most of his time writing requests for admission to such groups as the Coordinating Center of EWR and the APN (Anti-Klostevik Bloc of Nations).
