OTTO, Hans

State Department records, checked 6 November 1951 in the name of subject, reflected as follows:

"The name of one Hans \_\_\_\_\_ referenced to dispatch to Stuttgart dated 10 March 50 indicating visa refused; copy furnished FBI & CIA."

"There was no further information relative to subject; identity of the above individual with subject could not be established."

The files of CIA contain the following information:

"A report dated 23 December 1948 reflects the following in reference to one Hans \_\_\_\_\_. Housekeeper for Berliner-Rundfunk officers mess. Russian informant. In 1947 lived in Berlin-Pankow, Carmen-Sylvastr."

"Age (1948) approx 52 Height 167 C.M.; dark hair, brown eyes, oval face."

"Mr. [ ] of the Russian desk OSO, provided the following of one of the same name as the subject:"

"Hans \_\_\_\_\_ was an associate of a chairman working for the Russian IS and he was connected with the Soviet-inspired kidnap attempt on an official of an anti-Soviet emigre organization."

"The secretary of one Hans \_\_\_\_\_, Giselia Hetler, was also allegedly working for the Russian Intelligence Service."

"A report dated 29 September 1944 reflects a Hans \_\_\_\_ was a pro-Nazi of Reichenback on den Fils (3 miles from Umingen), reportedly was an early ardent Nazi and was one of the first to lend trucks for party meetings. He owned the greater part of the family spinning and weaving mills and held some position in the industrial organization of the party."

"A report dated 20 April 50 states one Hans \_\_\_\_\_ (procurement of material) is listed as one of the important personnel of the organization committee of the FDJ Deutschlandtreuen".
