We received your 16 May 2010 letter providing some additional information pertaining to your Privacy Act request referenced above. However, we are unable to process your privacy request at this time because we require additional information that you still have not provided.

As stated in our 29 April 2010 letter the Privacy Act requires federal agencies to safeguard personally identifiable information about an individual. CIA's Privacy Regulations, Title 32 C.F.R. § 1901.13, establish the criteria below:

An individual seeking access to or amendment of records about himself shall provide in the letter of request his full (legal) name, address, date and place of birth, and current citizenship status together with a statement that such information is true under penalty of perjury or a notarized statement swearing to or affirming his identity. In the case of an individual who is an alien lawfully admitted for permanent residence, said individual shall provide his or her alien registration number and the date that status was acquired.

We are closing your request at this time. If you wish to make a new request, please provide all the required information.
