On 5 September 1949 it was reported that the Chinese garrison at Karghalik (77-26, 37-54) had mutinied, and the route from Sinkiang Province to Kashmir via Karakoram was accordingly closed. By 10 September 1949 the mutiny had been suppressed, and the route was again open.

* Comment. The closure of the route from Tash Kurehan (75-14, 37-54) into Pakistan via Gilgit, which was reported in [redacted] was occasioned by banditry. The previous report of Soviet troops in the area has been denied. (b)(1)
