1. Reference (not to FDM) suggests that Subject is or was associated with the Czech IS. Because she is in frequent contact with V-3597 and subordinates, and because, as the key intelligence figure within the PERISEY organization, she least large in the plans of V-3597, we passed some of the allegations on to him and requested that he check. The results are the followings

The first charge was that BLASCHTOWITSCHKA had been arrested in Frague in 1967, had claimed at the time to be working for the Czech IS, and had been released after a telophone call to an intelligence installation. V-3597 makes the following reply:

a. BIASCHTUATTOCHKA was living in Immelstetten, Landkreis Findolheim, in 1946. She was in such acute financial distress that she had insufficient food and clothing. At the end of November 1946 she crossed illegally into the CSR (in the Furth i. Wald srea). In the middle of Decemfor, having visited relatives during her two weeks absence, she returned with food and clothing to Garmany. She was checked by Garman police in the area of Waldsassen, paid duty on the articles in her possession, and went on her way. At the end of Jamuny 1947 she again crossed illegally into the CSR, erossing via Hundebach, Egerteich, Krasma Lipa, and Cheb. She again visited relatives for fourteen days; but this time she brought them gifts of food and other articles, chiefly cigarettes. She also made contact, while in the CCE, with a Dutch citizen, a friend of her feelly, named M. CARCOTR. The Dutchman, who lived in Amsterdam, enabled her to buy various blackmarket items which she brought back to Germany. Rejulives also provided her with a false Czech identity card, under the name K. PUKCHNA, at the time of this visit.

b. She made her third trip into the CSR in March 1947. The female relative with whom she cuntommily stayed was sway on a trip and BLASCH-TCHITSCHIA was forced to go to a hotel, the "Sokolsky dum" in Prague III.

Here she used her false identification. She was excented in the hotel scentification by secret police and irrought to police headquarters in Frague II, fartelemejoka ulice he. Here she was interrogated throughout the night. It was established that her identification was false, and she was accused of being an agent of a bestern IS. She refused to tall who had given her the false identity card. She numaged to not ward to her brother, who inferred a family friend, a man who was at that time an influential political figure. Patek had once been rescued from a people's court by HAZGHUMITCHZA's husband and had in turn tried to save the life of the latter in 1945. He made no attempt to recruit her for the Cooch IS, nor was turne any indication that he had such a tic himself. 3. The second charge was that Vladimir PERISET himself undertook an investigation of subject in 1949 because of presistant remore that she was working as an agent for the Casch Ministry of the Interior. V-3597 answers that

this charge was made to PERLIET by a female CIC scurce. PERFLEET, who at almost too correct, did not flatly deny the CIC charge. On the other hand, according to his own assertions, he has never entertained the slightest suspicious about Subject. In order to be sure, however, that he was not placed in the position of ignoring an American worning, he did smarch the correspondence and personal property of Subject without her knowledge. He found nothing suspicious. He emported the above to CIC in order to make it clear that PLACKINGTISCHEA was not suspect and to be free of the needling of the CIC source.

the This CI check of PLACONTOCIFA was run by V-21215 and V-21513, each working without the knowledge of the other. Both have known Subject for three years; both have been in close association with her; each is completed that she is, from the point-of-view of the West, completely reliable. Further evidence of hor attitude is that she is planning to use members of her immediate family, inside the CCR, for IS purposes. One such member, now travelling in Bulgaria, has already agreed to work.
