Removal from Military Establishment
Security Program; notice and hearing

Provisions of section 652 of this title, which provide for the removal from the classified civil service of a person who is an employee of the Military Establishment and who has been guilty of espionage, sabotage, or a crime involving the national defense, require the giving of notice to such person that within thirty days after such notice he shall have an opportunity personally to appear before the board and to submit affidavits in support of his position. § 653. Same; summary removal from Military Establishment for conduct inimical to defense program; notice and hearing

Notwithstanding the provisions of section 652 of this title, the Secretary of War may remove from the classified civil service of the United States any employee of the Military Establishment forthwith upon a finding that such person has been guilty of conduct inimical to the public interest in the defense program of the United States and upon the giving of notice to such person of such charges: Provided, That within thirty days after such removal such person shall have an opportunity personally to answer such charges in writing and to submit affidavits in support of such answer.
