SUBJECT: MOSBY, Aline
BELITSKY, Boris

Mr. Karl KOCH, Acting Chief Temporary News Bureau in Brussele advised on 1 September 1958 that he had attended a cocktail party on 31st of August given by a Miss Aline MOSBY. He stated that Miss MOSBY works for North American Sevapaper Alliance, is about 30 years of age, and had been fired from a wire service in the USA for having leaked information to Confidential magazine. He stated that she plays footsie with the Russians and is a co-existence type, stated that she is a very good writer and is employed as a stringer for NANA and that he had used one or two of her articles after re-writing them.

Also in attendance at the party was one Boris BELITSKY who became known to Mr. Koth during his temporary stay in Brussels. Mr. BERKTSKY is a technician with Radio Moscow. When Mr. BELITSKY accepted Miss MOSBY's invitation he asked Miss MCSBY not to ask any intelligence type or NKVD types to the cocktail party. HELITSKY is approximately 38 years of age, lived in the United States 1927-1931 while his father was on a trade commission there. BELITSKY has been criticised by the regime for his friendliness with Westerners so that at other than social affairs when BELITSKY meets Western correspondents he merely gives a nod but when he is in private he is quite friendly. He apparently has less money than other correspondents and it was learned that hehad saved a little nest egg of about 200 Belgian Francs which he wishem to use to try out a system he had devised to win at roulette. He had asked a miss Frieda LAMM who is a correspondent at the press center at the Exposition if she could get him into the Casino Ostenda without his having to show any credentials. He was planning to go on the 4th and 5th of September.

This information was passed to demise who exhibited interest in BELITSKY and asked if additional information on him sould be obtained. The opportunity presented itself when Mr. KOCH called me at my home before office hours on 3 September and stated that he had been invited by BELITSKY to take a ride in the country. I asked KCH to try and get more biographic data on BELITSKY, where his family was, what his father was duing, how long he was going to be in Brussels. On 5 September Mr. KOCH called and advised that BELITSKY was a mixed up fellow, that he had suffered under STALIN and apparently not too friendly to theregime but was basically nationalistic.

I asked Mr. KOCH if he had made an approach to him and he said definitely he forthcoming within the next two or three days.

- 1. Zhukov was hope of all but not strong or clever enough. Uncut text of Zhukov speech at Leningrad on Armed Forces Day seen by informant was never fully published and was ordered cut by Party supervisor. Uncut version demanded more even than Khrushchev's speech at 20th Congress including restriction of influence of Party organs and political apparatus.
- 2. Khrushchev forced to make 20th Party Congress speech by pressure from intelligentsia. Everybody expected conditions to improve afterwards but still waiting. Informant saw full speech.
- 3. If government does not follow course of liberalization it will give trump hand to the more extreme emigre proposals.
 - 4. Pasternak's Dr. Zhivago expresses the feelings of many intellectuals.
 - 5. Western broadcasts should concentrate on students and intelligentsia.
