On 9 December 1954 SUBJECT, born 12 February 1912 in Hungary, accompanied by <u>Sandor Mahoty</u> , born 12 April 1920 in Zaposvar, Hungary, was interviewed at his own request by Informant 21-02 in Salzburg, Land Salzburg, Austria. SUBJECT stated that his purpose in requesting the interview was to officially inform the 430th CIC Detachment that Sandor Mahoty, under SUBJECT's direction and control, was employed in the US Zone of Austria as an official representative of the British FSS intelligence organization. SUBJECT stated that he wanted Mahoty's British affiliation made known to the 430th CIC Detachment in order to avoid any misunderstanding concerning Mahoty's future activities in the US Zone of Austria. During the interview SUBJECT disclosed substantially the following concerning his employment as an intelligence operative for the British FSS:															
e. SUBJECT, who is currently residing at Siegfried Strasse 3, Munich, Germany, was, until the spring of 1952, a member of a small group of former Hungarian Army officers employed as intelligence operatives for a US intelligence agency headed by the (former German Army General) Reinhardt Gehlen. SUBJECT's group was headed by one <u>Ian Hodocz</u> , former Hungarian Gendarmerie general, currently residing in Brazil, South America. During the spring of 1952 SUBJECT's group was dismissed by General Gehlen, reason for the dismissal not revealed by SUBJECT. Shortly after being dismissed by General Gehlen, SUBJECT was contacted by an officer representative of the British FSS in Klagenfurt, Land Carinthia, Austria, name not revealed by SUBJECT, and offered employment by the FSS. SUBJECT was instructed to organize a small group of former Hungarian Army officers among the members of SUBJECT's former group, which was headed by Mahoty, mentioned above. SUBJECT stated that he organized a group consisting of himself, Sandor Mahoty in Salzburg, Jozsef Soltra in Inns, Land Upper Austria, and two persons each in Klagenfurt and Munich, names not revealed by SUBJECT. SUBJECT was directed by the aforementioned officer representative of the British FSS to report directly to one <u>Sandor Marosa</u> , former Hungarian Army colonel, in Klagenfurt, who was designated as SUBJECT's contact agent. SUBJECT's group was engaged in recruiting and training intelligence agents for the purpose of gathering PI information in Hungary and depositing in Hungary for possible future use, radios, explosives, arms and ammunition, and propaganda material. SUBJECT's group was continuously employed by the British FSS from 1952 until 1 June 1954. During that period SUBJECT employed Jozsef Soltra and <u>Iron Rud nee Szabo</u> , both Hungarian refugees in Salzburg, as casual informants, each having received approximately 2000 Austrian schillings per month. Iron Rud nee Szabo was dismissed in May 1954 because of her inefficiency and Jozsef Soltra will be released out-

right as of 1 January 1955, because of being personally involved in man-smuggling between Hungary and the US Zone of Austria. In June 1954, allegedly because of a lack of funds, the British dissolved their PI group in Klagenfurt, headed by the aforementioned Sandor Marcsa, and retained as intelligence operatives only SUBJECT, Mahoty and two operatives in Munich, names not revealed by SUBJECT. Jenoe Halpay was released in June 1954, because of the alleged lack of funds. Since June 1954 SUBJECT has been directly responsible to the aforementioned British FSS representative in Klagenfurt.

b. SUBJECT stated that although the group he originally organized for the British FSS consisted of MHBK members, the group was not employed as an official organ of the MHBK, but as an independent group only. SUBJECT was instructed by his British control agent in 1952 to inform each member of SUBJECT's group that in case they should ever be officially questioned by any authority other than the British, they should state that they were officially employed by the MHBK as intelligence operatives. SUBJECT stated that he had often consulted the MHBK central files in Munich in order to further certain assignments and missions, and that he had done so with the knowledge and consent of Andreas Zako, former Hungarian Army major general, current head of the MHBK. In order to gain Zako's consent to SUBJECT's use of the MHBK central files, SUBJECT has paid Zako a monthly fee of 2000 Austrian schillings since late 1953. According to SUBJECT's knowledge, that amount has been Zako's only source of income.

c. SUBJECT further stated that during the summer of 1953 he was approached by a representative of the US Air Force Intelligence in Munich, Germany, and given test missions concerning the obtaining of a complete order of battle of the Hungarian Air Force. SUBJECT was promised that in the event his group was able to perform the test missions in a satisfactory manner, he would be employed and given a budget of approximately \$5000 per month. SUBJECT stated that although he was officially employed by the British FSS, he decided to undertake the test missions for the US Air Force Intelligence and that if he was accepted for employment, he would sever his group's employment by the British FSS. SUBJECT's group allegedly completed the aforementioned test missions within three months, in a very satisfactory manner; however, his group was not accepted for employment by the US Air Force Intelligence. SUBJECT attributed his failure to secure employment by the US Air Force Intelligence to false denunciations against his group by one Georg Kollonyi, an employee of a US intelligence agency in

Salzburg, and to political intrigues directed against his group and the entire MHEK by the Hungarian National Council's Executive Committee in New York, USA.

d. SUBJECT concluded by stating that his British FSS superiors have promised to clear through the USFA G-2 channels Mahoty's intelligence activities in the US Zone of Austria and have further instructed SUBJECT to avoid in any way possible any interference with the US intelligence agencies in the US Zone of Austria. SUBJECT further promised his future cooperation with the CIC by submitting to the CIC, any information of a counterintelligence nature concerning the US Forces in Austria. (C-3)

Agent's Notes: Attention is invited to numerous Agent Reports originating in Regions A and B, wherein Jozsef Soltra, mentioned above, has been referred to as an MHEK intelligence operative. According to the foregoing reports, Jozsef Soltra has been employed since 1952 as a casual informant for the British FSS, operating under MHEK cover.

On 14 December 1954 the card files of Region A, 430th CIC Detachment, were examined concerning the personalities mentioned above and the following was revealed:

Jozsef Soltra, born 1 January 1911 in Visnye, Hungary, address: Sachgasse, Salzburg. Soltra is mentioned in numerous reports during the period from October 1949 through 1954 as an alleged MHEK intelligence operative and as a man-smuggling intermediary in Salzburg, last reference: Agent Report Ho-430-A-11-00151, S-25799, dated 26 November 1954, Subject: "OEDI, Imre Re: Master List of Man-Smugglers Operating between Hungary and the US Zone of Austria".

Iren Rad noe Szabr, born 16 August 1906 in Hornadszentandras, Hungary, address: Eichstrasse 10, Salzburg. Rad is mentioned in numerous reports during the period from early 1952 to 1954 as being an official Salzburg correspondent for the MHEK; last reference: Agent Report S-22784, dated 16 June 1954, Subject: GERVANYI, Istvan, Possible AVII Contact, Land Burgenland, Zurnsdorf, Austria".

X Sandor Hahoty aka Alexander Heber, identical to Sandor Hahoty, mentioned in the foregoing report, *X* born 12 April 1920 in Kapovar, Hungary, address: Camp Glasenbach, Land Salzburg. Hahoty is mentioned in numerous reports during the period from 1949 through 1954 as an alleged LHMZ intelligence operative and as an alleged leader of a Hungarian resistance group in Austria; last reference: Agent Report S-22784, dated 16 June 1951, Subject: "SERVNYI, Istvan, Possible AVI Contact, Land Salzburg, Austria".

X Janos Holand, possibly identical to Janos Halway, mentioned in the foregoing report, born 5 March 1897 in Pccavarad, Hungary. Janos Holand is mentioned as being a US visa applicant, no further identifying data.

Georg Kollonyi, born 13 September 1905 in Porjusos, Hungary, address: Pöhlweggasse 29, Salzburg. Kollonyi is mentioned in numerous reports as being the head of the Salzburg branch of the Golden Intelligence Group (GIG); last reference: Agent Report HO-450-A-1-32494, S-25276, dated 20 November 1954, Subject: "BARO, Andreas, Leader, LHMZ".

Andreas Salco, born 23 March 1898 in Trassov, Hungary, address: Landhaus, Schmid Hall, Land Tirol, Austria. Salco is mentioned in numerous reports during the period from 1947 through 1954 as being the head of the LHMZ; last reference: Agent Report HO-450-A-1-32494, S-25276, dated 20 November 1954, Subject: "BARO, Andreas, Leader, LHMZ".

X Pal Holoman-Strahl, identical to Pal Nedosy, mentioned in the foregoing report is mentioned in numerous reports dealing with Hungarian espionage organizations as being a former GIG operative, and as currently residing in Brazil. Last reference: Agent Report S-15372, dated 17 June 1953, subject of report not listed.

Reinhardt's Galken, former German Army general, is mentioned in numerous reports as being the key man in the intelligence net operated by LHMZ in Austria; last reference: Agent Report HO-450-A-1-32494, S-25276, dated 20 November 1954, Subject: "BARO, Andreas, Leader, LHMZ".

On 22 December 1954 an examination of the Central Records Office, 1200th Air Detachment, revealed that Anthony RADOCZY, identical to [redacted], born 12 February 1912. is mentioned in Dossier Number 16050, Agent Report HO-450-A-4, dated 22 October 1954, Page 1, Volume 5, as being a former intelligence operative.
