CONTACT REPORT ON MEETING BETWEEN

The undersigned met CAKEISTA 2 in Brussels on October 8 1951 to discuss general AEQUOR matters and for the specific purpose of getting CAP (Combined Assessment Program CSOB/ARELOPE) under way.

1. Immediate electing of Candidates in Germany for Assessment:

It was decided that CANBISTA 2 would send one of the max previously used for spotting in Gurmany to alert candidates for CAP assessment. His task would be:

a. Direct candidates to appear at prearranged mosting place, date and time for transportation to the assessment center.

b. Warn them of strictest security mindedness on the grounds that all matters relating to the preparation of possible conflict with the U.S.S.R. should obviously require complete discretion. Warning should contain the failwring:

(1) Careless talk would compromise U.3.-Belorussian relations, thus constituting a grave blaw to Belorussian interests.

(2) Violators will be considered as traiters by the Belorussian #stional Authorities.

(3) Violators will be prosecuted by the U.S.

Spotter will tell subjects that per agreement between U.S. and Belerussian authorities they are going to be assessed by a U.S. commission whose task it will be to gauge their military qualifications. Spotter will assist candidates in selecting a cover most appropriate to their individual case.

2. Availability of Proposed Lisison Han:

The undersigned suggested that subject previously recommended by CAMBISTA 2 for liaison work be assessed along with the first CAP package. GAMBISTA 2 seemed confident that proposed lisison wan would be available on 16 October at the latest. It was decided to start assessing other subjects on 16 October regardless of lisison man's availability. For security purposes, GAMBISTA 2 was to tell lisison man that subjects who will be assessed along with him are being lesked into for possible wartime use only.

In order to furnish us with a preview of his assessing capabilities, which, if sleared, may be one of his functions with us, liaison man will be asked to make personal observations on other canditates potentials and communicate his findings to us. CAMBISTA 2 requested special disposal handling of liaison man in the event that we find him unsuitable for our use. CAMBISTA 2 suggested that liaison man be neutralized with a newspaper job and odd non-sensitive tasks in

a. CAMBISTA 2 appeared seriously worried at the possibility of our rejecting candidates which he especially recommends (re CAMPOSAMID 3's disposal on 21 August 1951). He stated that it would engender the locs of his prestige in Belerassian political sireles. He also stated that his and CAMBISTA 4's understanding (re CAMBISTA 4's talks with 4.5. officials in Jashington) had been that CAM-BISTA 2 would be entirely responsible for the unquestionable and unquestioned been fide of especially recommended candidates. CAMBISTA 2 feels that our assessment methods (Carriage) are retraction of original statements and an indication of lack of confidence toward CAMBISTA 2 and 4. CAMBISTA 2 stated that he would refuse dealing with us in his present capacity if it would involve putting his in an embarrassing position in Belorusuian political circles.

b. The above statements were made with unusual heat and a vehenence incompatible with CAMRISTA 2's behavior to date, exposing to the undersigned the rigid aspects of CAMRISTA 2's political ambition and fear of political blemish.

c. The mituation appeared serious enough to warrant an attempt towards a compression. The undersigned suggested that the problem could be eased a good deal if approached from another angle; mainly, that CAMBISTA 2 make loss positive commitments when recruiting oven the most likely prospect, basing his reservation on the fact that Americans make it a point to approach all subjects objectively, regardless of subjects' references and basking, since only an objective and lovelheaded opinion can be an ulighten and protect all concerned. Also, that final decision on all subjects lies not with one American but with an accumulation of various opinions and debates, the outcome of which CAMBISTA 2 could not predict with accuracy.

d. By way of compression and in order to protoct CAMENISTA 2 from future embarramenet, it was suggested that cases involving subjects particularly recommended by him should be handled in such a manner that if dispetal becomes necessary all efforts should be made, jointly with CAMENISTA 2, to make it as painless as pessible.

e. The following precedure governing possible disposal of individuals respecially recumended by CANBISTA 2 was agreed upon:

(1) He assess.

- (4) All decide on a painless disposal.

f. CAMPOSANTO 3's (He 345 CMCMU) dispessed case was again rehashed. CAMBISTA 2 reparted that CAMPOSANTO 3 was bitter, crushed, and crying on CAMBISTA 4's shoulder. Also, that he was shouting his mouth off about our assessment methods in spite of secrecy agreement. The undersigned reminded CAMBISTA 2 that the U.S. takes an extremely dim view of secrecy agreement brenches and warned CAMBISTA 2 of serious repercessions thereof. On CAMBISTA 2's insistence that we re-assess CAMPOSANED73,

CANBISTA 2 suggested that the salaries of Belorussian personnel eventually employed by us to discharge the functions of lision, w/t instructor, housekeeper, sts., could be paid by me of their representatives (presumbly CAMEISTA 2), thus:

- a. Preventing subjects from getting that old "agent" feeling.
- b. Presenting them with the fact that their salaries are drawn from a sum contributed by the U.S. for overall support of the Belorusaian cause.
- Keeping us out of financial quibbles.
- (CONVENT: Giving CAMBISTA 2 added power over Belerussian personnel.) d.

5. CAMBISTA 2's Progress Report:

a. Balgina: Two additional candidates have been spotted. Freliminary FRy has been furnished on one candidate. FRQ on second candidate will be forthcoming on 22 October. Both cendidates are available for assessment immediately.

Additional information on candidates spotted in August b. France: has been furnished. Information on availability of candidates for assessment will be fortheaming on 22 October. New regions are being canvassed.

c. <u>Sprland</u>: CAMPOSANTO 1 letter-drop in London has been elerted (Re MUNIFG 4924). Assurance obtained from readiver that CAMBISTA 2 would be notified immediately upon receipt of expected letter. Receiver stated having received a letter from Sender about a month ago. CAMBISTA 2 feels that his contact with Receiver was achieved without major security compromise. Availability for assessment of candidates spotted in August will be forthcoming on 22 October. New regions are being canvassed.

- d. Odd: (1) World survey of Belerassian political organizations will be fortheoning on 22 October.
 - (2) CAMBESTA 2 furnished a peper entitled "Basis, Ideology and -Folicy of the BMR", prepared in Russian for our analysis.
 - (3) A bulletin issued by the Independent Party in French and Soylish containing IP comments on current affairs will come out at the end of Uctober.
- (4) A w/t instructor type, former w/t instructor with Ander's Army, has been spotted in England. Another candidate with some w/t qualifications has been spotted in Belgium. Additional information on both subjects will be forthcoming on 22 October.

6. Request for Additional Financial Support:

a. CANELSTA 2 introduced a new request pertaining to extended financial sid beyond the present newspaper-pushing agreement. CANELSTA 2 stated that aid is needed for general Belorussian organizational purposes. In GANELSTA 2's estimatime, an important contribution would be allotnests and by us to vericus Belorussian officials enabling them to devote full time to their official daties, rather than being compelled to occupy the better portion of their day in abstract salaried employment.

b. GamBISTA 2 added that similar aid was being extended by us to other emigre groups and named Kerensky as one of the recipients. He suggested that is same such support sould be worked out in the future, we could furnish a round ever-all support figure to a key Belerassian official for distribution where most meeted.

c. The above requests were presented by CAMBISTA 2 with moderation, and no claim, as such, was gelt. The undersigned interjected that it was important to preserve the rere quality of U.S.-Belevussian relations to date by an ever present averances among Belevussians that our relations should never/Bilowed to deteriorate into a more dollar usage presess. The point was stressed that U.S. relations with some of the other emigre groups have been severed due to precisely this type of miscenception.

d. With a liberal amount of onlogy and semmalis, the undersigned got the warming agrees that the U.S. will not play rich uncle if it is felt that extracting dellars from us is the Bolorussians' only objective.

e. Detailed discussions relating to extended support were pestponed to the next scheduled meeting with CAMBISTA 2 in Munich on or about 22 Getober.
