He is also a cleared consultant of the Agency and is willing and even enthusiastic to participate in such a research project.

There is ample space in the to conduct such a research project. can be easily wired for sound recording and the large could be used for the administration of drugs. Beds and toilet facilities would be available if necessary.

(2) On the other hand, there are some difficulties. The conduction of such an experiment would not fit easily into the routine of the . I am assuming that the administration of drugs and subsequent interrogation would require from four to six hours. This would probably have to be done in addition to the routine procedure of the and would probably mean the individual would have to be called back for the second visit. Likewise, it seems to me essential that a medical man be present during the entire amount of this time. If something untoward occurred, it possibly would be necessary to hospitalize the individual at the and in this event the admitting officer or admitting physician would have to be told what led up to the existing physical condition. It is possible that someone at the hospital could be cleared but inasmuch as there is a great deal of variation in duty hours for the medics at the Hospital, the situation would be almost impossible to control. Any severe physical reactions could be treated in the _____ hospital and even if a death occurred, it is not likely that it would create a serious crisis. Experimentation with different drugs and various dosages of drugs could be tried out here as physicians are always available and the time of the subjects is _____. Many of the _____ of this have passed through the _____ in _____ consequently, information about the subjects would be available from an independent source.

After sufficient experience is gained from the use of a drug, it might then be used in a more open situation and perhaps administered surreptitiously. Experiments using hypnosis and drugs could also be more readily conducted in the _____.

Some disadvantages occur. One, the location of the _____ is such that participation of Agency consultants would be more difficult. Also, since this is a _____, the co-operation of _____ is necessary and they might be more likely to let information leak out.

1. The Pros and Cons

B
The advantages of doing work in this institution is that a combination of psychotic and non-psychotic patients would be available. Practically all of the psychopaths have passed through the [redacted] at [redacted] and independent information would be available on them. Some of the other patients will have likewise gone through the [redacted]. The staff of this hospital is very small and it is likely that they would welcome such an experiment inasmuch as they are able to do practically nothing with the psychopaths and psychotics would make good subjects for our purposes. (With the psychotics and psychopaths, it is likely the authorities would be more willing to permit experimentation with drugs.)

The disadvantages of this institution are that any work conducted there would probably have to be done by personnel furnished by the project. Again, the distances from [redacted] would make difficult the participation of consultants there. It may be felt that the number of non-psychotics will not furnish enough material for our purposes.

(C) The [redacted] was suggested as a possible sponsoring agency for the research project because the [redacted] has received grants from many organizations to carry on research projects and [redacted] is on the staff. Since they now all conduct very sponsored research programs, it furnishes a very good cover for such a program as ours. Also, [redacted] has several contacts in the [redacted] He knows [redacted] and [redacted] very well. Presumably, such a program would come under the [redacted] Department and other participants selected by the Agency would work with him. The [redacted] is adjacent to the [redacted] [redacted] accordingly, a research project under [redacted] in the [redacted] would be ideally located for money consultants.

(B) There are several disadvantages in attempting to set up a research program through [redacted] or any other [redacted]. The administration of funds would necessarily go through the usual [redacted] channels. It would be difficult to obtain full control of the conduct of the experimentation. Numerous individuals in the University would have to be given at least some information about the nature of the research. There is always the possibility of some members of the [redacted] being interested in the project who might not be

desirable from the Agency's point of view but who could not be graciously excluded. It is likely that a considerable number of people would have to be cleared. Such a grant and the conduct of research would necessarily receive the usual publicity. It is also possible that certain individuals of the _____ might voice objections to work of this type after much work had been put into the project. It might be difficult to have _____ appointed as director of the research project as he does not hold a professorial rank in the _____ nor are his connections with the _____

XX. Direct Methods of Sponsorship

B
It is possible that a research program could be conducted directly by personnel recruited by the Agency. For example, it might be feasible and plausible that _____ receive a grant to conduct research in the field of _____ in which they are all interested. They in turn could use their departments to conduct research and convince their superiors that it would not interfere with their usual routine. This method has the advantage of the Agency retaining absolute control over the direction and supervision of the project. It is also possible that the above named individuals or others might be given grants singly and carry on simultaneous projects at different locations.

The [] facilities could best be utilized for research using drugs and the [] or perhaps drugs and hypnosis. Drugs that could be given surreptitiously would be preferable. The [] would not be ideal for more extensive use of drugs because of the number of people who would have to be cleared, because all of the subjects (we trust after []) would be [] side effects could not be easily handled, etc.

B+C

At the present time, [] gives [] tests to people coming into the [], not for the purpose of determining [] but as a method of probing their emotional complexes. He does not require any additional authority to do this and in some instances he is even directed by the [] to administer [] tests for the purpose of determining []. Since [] is known as somewhat of an "expert" in the [] field it would be more natural for him to do research in that field. Makowicz, he could do this without all of us [] being "cut in".

Setting up any research project involving [] organizations will require long and complicated procedures, particularly if there are denials of clearance on some individuals who may be only incidental to the program.

B+C

In fact, anticipated difficulties in some of the institutions are so great that their usefulness becomes questionable. Setting up such a project through the auspices of [] also offers many obstacles. In light of this, I recommend that if possible a direct and simple method of sponsorship be utilized. I believe that it is possible that a large and broad organization such as the [] could grant research money to an individual or a group of individuals to do research in the general field of [] including the use of drugs. If [] or [] singly or as a group, were given such funds, they in turn could obtain permission from their superiors to conduct research in their departments merely giving the cover story and not discussing the interest of the Agency in such a program. Is prominent citizens, identified with the field of [] I believe that they could approach the officials of the [] in the same manner and obtain the facilities of [] institutions without discussing their ultimate purposes.

C

As a preliminary, clearance has been requested for []. I recommend that the clearance of [] be expedited and that of [] be held in abeyance. After these men are cleared, a conference could be arranged

B either in _____ or in Washington to get their definite reactions to such a proposal. If they concurred in such a plan, then steps could be initiated to obtain clearances for _____ if this fund organization is to be used, _____ and any others considered necessary. If this plan is followed, it will be possible to actually determine whether a research program can be conducted at _____, the _____ or other institution without unduly "tipping our hand". In any event, the project should be set up so that it will furnish the Agency as much control as possible, require the clearance of a minimum number of people and occasion little or no publicity.

XXII. Costs

Determination of cost could not be made as this would vary greatly depending on where or what research projects were set up. A cursory investigation and discussion on the subject of cost, however indicates the greatest expense will be fees to be paid to consultants co-operating in the program. Most of the equipment is available at the various suggested installations. Other equipment and supplies could be furnished by the Agency. After a definite program is accepted, a more exact determination of cost can be ascertained.
