

- Fernando VALERA Aparicio, Finance Minister of the Spanish Republican (b)(1) Government in Exile, indicated to source at the beginning of October (b)(3) 1950 that the financial situation of the exile government had sufficiently improved to permit the continued carrying on of activities which VALERA described as modest, but sufficient for the present time.
- 2. VALURA stated that the exile government had received assurances that the subsidies which it had been receiving from Mexico and Cuba would continue. Financial aid from Guatemala, he admitted, was less certain because of the unsettled state of the government there.
