*Formal Report on Carriage Test of Camuse I on 12 September 1951.

- 1. Object of Test: Assessment.
- 2. Procedure: Standard, with interpreter.
- 3. Estimated Reliability of the Test Results: Subject was moderately but consistently responsive, and it is believed the results may be classified as "reliable" in the scale of "reliable", "fairly reliable", and "unreliable".
- 4. Summary of Test Results: Subject appears to be the person he claims to be and not an enemy agent or criminal. He appears to be telling the main truth about his career and motivation and to be strongly anti-bommunist.
- 5. Carriage Officer's Appraisal of Subject: Subject has a worn appearance, which is consistent with his eventful life history, and appears to be rather emotional, although not abnormally so. Could be a very useful little grey men!
- 6. Remarks & Recommendations: If any records exist on the sward of the German "Ritterkreuz", it might be advisable to check them concerning this individual.

Re Para 6: Since only seven persons of his nationality were awarded the RITTERKREUZ, and since subject is widely known as one of these persons, as well as being personally known to RNPILLOW, deception is not believed possible in this connection. Subject was definitely awarded the RITTERKREUZ; whether or not be believes he descreed it might explain his reaction. Subject is modest about his last accomplishments, although not are interested.
