<p>Although we agreed with SCABER's opinion that former Soviet citizens, using a stateless passport, could be expected to have difficulty in obtaining a visitor's visa to the USSR, it was decided to query the BV regarding any such cases which might have come to their attention. Heinrich Simon WEYDE recalled several instances of emigres resident in the Federal Republic who had been allowed to visit the USSR and then return to Western Germany but was unable to provide from memory any further details. He also stated that he was certain that similar trips had been made by emigres resident in other West European countries. It is presumed of course that these privileged travelers would be subjected to Soviet recruitment approaches either before or during the course of their stay in the USSR. The current ARESUMAC operation being handled by FOB is a case in point.</p>
